

Community Lead

Salary: £28,300

Contract: Full-time, with potential for part-time options or job-share PAYE 12-months contract. Probation period of 3 months.

Location: Working in-person from Newham and from home, with options to work at Repowering London's office in Brixton.

About the role

This is an exciting opportunity for a Newham resident who cares about tackling climate change locally and leading their borough towards a more inclusive and sustainable future.

As a Community Lead in the Newham borough, you will have two main objectives: to grow and develop Community Energy Newham into a lively and vibrant co-op, and to run community outreach activities around the domestic retrofit sector (as part of a joint project with another London based community energy organisation, SELCE). You will be employed by Repowering London and work together with our Newham Communities Project Manager.

We are looking for a Newham resident with a strong network in the local communities, and an interest in community organising.

As a Community Lead, you will:

- Gain valuable work experience, join a motivated team, boost your confidence and grow your network;
- Learn about and dive deep into community energy, community engagement methods and community-led domestic retrofit.

About Community Energy Newham

Community Energy Newham (CEN) is the first borough-wide community energy co-operative in Newham. It aims to lead the borough towards a more inclusive and sustainable future, drive local climate action, and create strong community ties, by installing community-owned solar panels and betting strongly on community engagement.

Founded in 2023, CEN is supported by the team at Repowering London, a community benefit society that co-create and facilitate community energy projects. Repowering London has worked with local residents and Newham Council to develop the co-operative and will support the Community Lead role. Repowering London supports nine other community energy co-ops across London.

Job description

Grow and develop CEN

- Build links and local partnerships with a wide range of groups and actors in the local community: associations, faith-based groups, environmental organisations, voluntary organisations, charities, youth or elderly clubs, community hubs, local businesses etc.
- Attend regular events, meetings, meet-ups, and activities with volunteers and community stakeholders to raise awareness of community energy and how it links with local movements
- Identify and recruit new members and volunteers to the Community Energy Newham cooperative.
- Support community share offer campaigns to raise funds for solar panel installations
- Contribute to shaping the direction of the co-op so that it reflects the aspirations of the local community
- Attend meetings with the co-op directors and interact regularly with volunteers
- Co-create and run community events, campaigns, and activities with CEN members
- Identify sites to install solar panels and reach out to site owners
- Refer local residents who are vulnerable or at risk to local services.

Retrofit Outreach and Engagement (as part of a joint project with SELCE)

- Co-design and deliver an outreach programme to engage residents to raise awareness about retrofit and how to upgrade the energy performance of their homes
- Deliver engagement events, such as workshops, webinars, and "retrofit parties"
- Work with households who are on a low income to support delivery of retrofit improvement measures paid for by existing government grant funding schemes, and those who will be funding the work themselves
- Assist with other duties within the scope and nature of the position and in other areas of the business when required.

Person specification

Repowering London will provide training and mentorship to enable anyone with the right learning and passion to develop on-the-job.

Essential

- Living in Newham
- Strong network of local contacts and knowledge of the area
- Interest in community organising and/or energy justice issues

Desirable

- Has experience working/volunteering in or with community groups
- Can work independently and remotely in an unstructured environment
- Is empathetic, outgoing, and open-minded
- Has good verbal communication skills and is comfortable with speaking in public
- Uses initiative to achieve targets
- Enjoys inspiring and encouraging people

You will be employed by Repowering London as the Newham Community Lead.

You must have the right to work in the UK.

Contract: Full-time, PAYE 12-months contract. Probation period of 3 months. We welcome candidates who want to work part time in a job-share, dependent on finding the right candidates to cover the hours needed.

Duration: 12 months starting from September or October 2024

Hours: Flexible working hours, evening/weekend work will sometimes be required.

Location: Working from home, with options to work at Repowering London's office in Brixton
